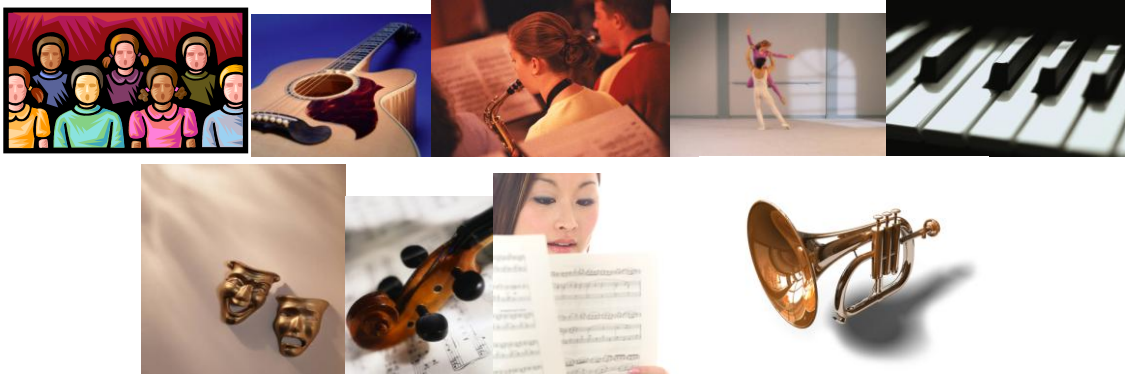

Message from the Board of Directors

On behalf of the Board of directors, I welcome you all to the 2012 Kelowna Performing Arts Festival. Our Festival has enjoyed an enduring and illustrious history, and 2012 marks its' 86th consecutive year as one of the premier performing arts events held in the central Okanagan. The Festival provides a showcase for amateur and young performing artists to demonstrate their achievements in music and speech arts to their families, peer group and the community at large. Many previous festival winners have gone on to become professional performers in their chosen disciplines.

This year's Festival begins on April 9 and concludes on April 27, followed by a Gala Concert on April 29, featuring many of the top performers as judged by a group of highly qualified adjudicators.

In 2011 some 750 entries comprising approximately 3000 participants, mostly from the Okanagan Valley, were registered in this event. A similar registration is expected in 2012. The Board is excited to advise of a change in performance venue this year. We have secured the performing facilities of Bottega, a new conference and retreat center located in East Kelowna, and about a 10 minute drive from downtown. The new venue will accommodate most of the disciplines, avoiding much of the need to change venues as in the past. We expect that piano, Strings, Woodwind and Brass, Vocal, Choral and Composition and Speech Arts will all be held at Bottega. We greatly appreciate this major sponsorship.

This Festival could not occur without the dedicated support of numerous volunteers, sponsors and donors, including the City of Kelowna, the Central Okanagan Foundation, the Kelowna District Arts Council, the Kiwanis Clubs of the Central Okanagan, District 7, Sandman Inns and Astral Media. We are deeply appreciative of their support.

In addition I would like to thank our very hard working Board of Directors, and in particular our Executive Director, Marvin Dickau. Marvin provides much of the behind-the-scenes work in putting this annual event together.

Good luck to all of the performing artists in this year's Festival, and welcome to all the family members, friends and general community who come to support them. We'll see you at the festival.

FESTIVAL GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

IMPORTANT!! Read these general rules before completing an Entry Form. Any questions not dealt with in these rules shall be referred to the Board. The Board's decision on rule violations shall be final.

ELIGIBILITY - Competitors must be bona fide residents of British Columbia or Northern Washington. All classes, unless otherwise specified, shall be open to amateurs only. ALL Open classes may be entered by non-amateurs, as a non-competitive entry. The term "amateur" shall mean one whose principal income is not derived from musical services. The condition does not apply to conductors of choirs or choral groups, nor to those bona fide students of music or dance, who teach for the purpose of applying the money so earned to the furtherance of their musical education, provided their Entry Form is signed by their teacher.

ENTRY INFORMATION - Be sure to provide complete information, including what type of instrument you will be using, the categories, class names, titles of selections, composer(s) and accurate performance time for each selection you enter. Competitors are responsible for entering the correct classes. The Festival cannot be responsible for detecting errors. A selection in a wrong category will receive adjudication only. No mark will be given. PLEASE NOTE: Any class may be entered in the non-competitive category. In this case, an adjudication will be given, but no mark. Non-competitive classes are not eligible for any awards.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT WHERE A GRADE LEVEL IS SPECIFIED FOR A CLASS, THE SELECTION MUST BE CHOSEN FROM THAT LEVEL USING SELECTIONS FROM THE ROYAL CONSERVATORY, A RECOGNIZED EQUIVALENT SYLLABUS, OR OTHER BOOKS AS SPECIFIED. IF IT IS NOT, IT WILL BE REJECTED AND THE FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.

Notwithstanding the above, all entries are the registrant's own choice unless otherwise specified. The Festival bears no responsibility for incorrect entries.

For contact information, please do not use the telephone number of your performing arts school, however, please provide your home or mobile number as well as your email address and that of your teacher and/or music school.

For your convenience, entry forms will be available on-line at www.kelownakiwanisfestival.com. Follow the links to complete and submit forms before JANUARY 31, 2012. Payment in the form of PayPal, a cheque or money order made payable Kiwanis Performing Arts Festival of Central Okanagan must be received no later than February 7, 2012 along with a copy of your registration confirmation. Incomplete forms or late forms will not be processed. There will be NO exceptions without a valid extenuating circumstance. In this case, the entry MAY be accepted for an additional payment of \$75.00.

PAYPAL – Now you can pay your fees by Credit Card, and you don't need a PayPal account.

PROCEDURE FOR ONLINE REGISTRATION (YOU MUST FOLLOW THE PROCEDURE)

The information you type into the registration form is exactly what will be printed in the program, so please remember to spell your name correctly, use capital letters **ONLY** where appropriate and check all the spellings of your selections, teachers and composers. It is the responsibility of competitors and teachers to follow the Rules & Regulations of the Festival. Entries are the responsibility of competitors and teachers. Errors or omissions are not the responsibility of the Festival.

NOTE: TITLES AND COMPOSERS/AUTHORS MUST BE INCLUDED WITH YOUR ORIGINAL ENTRY IN ORDER TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PROGRAM. TITLES CANNOT BE ADDED LATER.

TO COMPLETE YOUR ON-LINE REGISTRATION, FOLLOW THE STEP BY STEP GUIDELINES FOUND IN THE ON-LINE PROCESS. REGISTER BY JANUARY 31, 2012.

When your registration is complete you will have a detailed list of your Competitor information, Entries information and Fees. PRINT OUT TWO (2) COPIES, RETAIN ONE FOR YOUR REFERENCE AND SUBMIT THE SECOND FORM WITH YOUR CHEQUE OR MONEY ORDER TO THE FESTIVAL BY January 31, 2012, OR USE PAYPAL (PREFERRED METHOD).

COPYRIGHT LAW - Only original scores or copies authorized by copyright owners may be used at Festival venues. In order to receive a mark for a performance, the performer must provide the adjudicator and accompanist with an original score or authorized copy of the selection to be performed. If a participant chooses material that is out of print or difficult to acquire, written permission from the copyright owner must be obtained to have the material copied. If the copyright owner has granted permission to use a copy, bring the letter of authorization to your class to produce if requested.

GRADE LEVELS - Age and birth date are required on all entries to be considered for the Provincial Festival. Accepted age shall be as of December 31 of the previous calendar year. Grade levels of all entries are determined by a recognized Canadian Syllabus, current or previous. The grade and age level must be consistent in all solo classes entered except where specified. Except for the Associate level, participants may not enter any grade competitively for more than two years. Any competitor who has successfully passed an exam during the calendar year **prior** to the Festival **MUST** perform music from the next higher grade. It is the responsibility of the performer and teacher to ensure this is correct.

PERFORMANCE SCHEDULING - Category and Grade will determine class divisions. To help avoid scheduling conflicts, please list all additional Disciplines and Classes entered (Groups, Music, Choirs, etc...). Classes may be scheduled for any day of the week. In fairness to all participants in competitive classes, the Festival cannot accommodate any one participant's or teacher's requests for preferential scheduling. Anyone requiring special scheduling is encouraged to enter the Festival on a non-competitive basis.

EVERY EFFORT IS MADE TO AVOID SCHEDULING CONFLICTS, HOWEVER, DUE TO THE SIZE OF THE FESTIVAL AND SURROUNDING FESTIVALS, WE REGRET THAT SPECIAL REQUESTS CANNOT BE CONSIDERED. The Festival Committee reserves the right to eliminate, combine, sub-divide or create classes as deemed necessary or to refuse any entry.

REGISTRATION - Registration slips with class numbers, performance times and dates will be sent by e-mail when scheduling is completed. Prior to each session, present the appropriate card(s) to the Adjudicator's Secretary. **IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT YOU PROVIDE YOUR EMAIL AND THAT OF YOUR TEACHER.**

FEES - See Section D under "Procedure for Online Registration" for payment instructions. Postdated cheques will **NOT** be accepted. No refunding of fees. The fee structure for each discipline is on the last page of each discipline section.

ADJUDICATION - To provide each participant with an equal opportunity to perform, teachers, participants, parents of participants, or members of the audience should have no unauthorized communication with any Adjudicator prior to or during the Festival. Please contact the Festival Office for appropriate time and procedure if you wish to communicate with an Adjudicator in any way, e.g., to express appreciation. Unauthorized communication with an Adjudicator will result in disqualification for the performer. The Adjudicator shall have discretionary power to stop any performance at any time. In all matters of adjudication, the Adjudicator's decision shall be final. **NO PROTEST OR COMPLAINT MAY BE ADDRESSED DIRECTLY TO ANY ADJUDICATOR.** Contact the on-site Festival representative or the Festival Office.

VENUES - No cameras, video recorders, tape recorders are allowed in the venue. All cellular phones must be turned off or silenced.

Unless a special room is provided, no part of the venue may be used for warm-up or practice during the Festival. A curtain, if provided in the venue, is not to be used in any performance. All lighting is preset and will remain the same for all entries. Do not move any item in or remove any item from the venue. Clip-on microphones and special effects are not permitted.

Family and friends of performers and other members of the audience must remain in the performance area.

If you have any questions contact the on-site Festival representative - do not talk to the Adjudicator (see above).

PERFORMANCE PROCEDURE - Please adhere to the following general procedures:

- Erase all marks and notations on/in books.
- With a pencil, mark the beginning and end of sections to be performed.
- For reference purposes, number the first measure of each line on the music provided to the Adjudicator.
- Attach the Registration slip to the page of the selection to be performed.
- Arrive at the venue at least 15 minutes before scheduled performance time.
- Sit in the forward section of the performance area or room.
- Provide your book to the Adjudicator's Secretary before your class begins.
- After performing, sit in the front seats in the performance room.
- **NB. It is your responsibility**, at the end of the class, to retrieve your books from the Adjudicator's Secretary.

Refer to the individual disciplines for further or specific instructions.

CONDUCT DURING A PERFORMANCE - Respectful silence is expected of everyone in the theatre or venue. No movement in or out of the theatre or venue is permitted. This applies to every festival location. Coaching of performers is not permitted.

DUETS - One partner **MUST** submit the entry. Please include each partner's name and age on the Entry Form. The age of the entry will be determined by the age of the older performer who will be responsible for payment of the duet fee. Split fees will not be accepted and your entry will not be registered.

GROUPS - A "group" consists of three or more performers – A completed Group Entry Form along with the entry fee should be submitted by a representative of the group or the Teacher/Director. Please list **ALL** members of the group/class with ages and birth dates. Five (5%) of the group may exceed the age/grade level entered. Adding all the ages together and dividing by the number in the group determines the class age. Please list names, ages and birth dates of all performers in the group on the Entry Form, or attach a list. In the case of a decimal point in calculating the average, all averages that end in .5 to .9 must be entered in the next higher age class. Any member of the group participating in other Festival classes should include group information on their Solo Entry Forms.

MUSIC - Please name your instrument and include categories, titles of selections, composers and accurate performance time for each selection. Selections performed in previous Kelowna Festivals may not be repeated. A selection may not be performed a second time in any other class in the current Festival, i.e.: an individual may not perform his/her group's selection again in a Solo class. No category may be entered more than once, i.e.: a second time in another age or grade level (unless otherwise specified).

“Contemporary Idiom” is a recently added category in Piano and Voice. Details may be found in the Conservatory Canada Syllabus or an equivalent syllabus. Go to conservatorycanada.ca for more information. The selections listed in the Syllabi are guidelines; any equivalent style and level of difficulty may be entered. It is the responsibility of the teachers and students to ensure that appropriate selections are entered.

SPEECH ARTS - Please include the category, title of selection, author, source and accurate performance time for each selection. Language and content of selections **must** be appropriate for all age levels of participants and audience. We encourage all participants to compete in several categories.

PROVINCIAL/NATIONAL STANDARDS, REQUIREMENTS AND PARTICIPATION

Top performers from the Festival as chosen by the Adjudicators will be recommended for the Performing Arts BC Annual Festival. For more or detailed information about Provincial Festival standards and requirements, and the Festival’s Syllabus check the above Performing Arts BC website at <http://www.performingartsbc.ca> . <http://www.fcmf.org> for National Festival. **NOTE: TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR RECOMMENDATION TO THE PROVINCIAL FESTIVAL, TWO (2) CLASSES MUST HAVE BEEN ENTERED IN THE SAME DISCIPLINE. CONSULT THE PROVINCIAL SYLLABUS FOR FULL DETAILS.**

All competitors who enter **TWO (2) or more classes in their discipline are eligible to win an award** and are encouraged to strive for excellence in all their entries. Award details will be posted on our website as soon as they are finalized. NOTE: To be eligible for an award, the competitor must have competed in at least 2 classes.

ORIGINAL COMPOSITION

This is a multi-discipline section, covering all voices and instrumentation, including choral works.

It is open to any competitor and replaces the original composition category in the individual disciplines.

PROCEDURE

The original composition may include any single voice or instrument, or any combination of voices and instruments. For example – it might be a piano solo, solo voice unaccompanied or with piano accompaniment, solo instrument, groups of instruments, and so on.

STEP ONE – The written composition must be at the Festival office before April 1, 2011 for an adjudication as a composition. A written adjudication will be provided.

STEP TWO – prepare the composition for performance by the voices and/or instruments as specified. The performance will be adjudicated.

FEE \$30.00 per entry which covers both adjudications.

GENERAL RULES FOR CHOIRS

Provide a list of all Choir members. Ages and birth dates are required for Youth Choirs. Five percent (5%) of the choir members may exceed the specified age limit.

All selections are the choir's choice. One of the selections may be a folk song. The total time for a performance is limited to 15 minutes. Please indicate the accurate performance time for each selection. Selection titles must be submitted with your entry.

Piano accompaniment only is permitted, unless otherwise specified. Taped accompaniment is not permitted. Choirs must arrange for their own accompanists and include their accompanist's name on the entry form.

All choir performances are recorded. The Festival retains the resulting CDs or cassette tapes until the Adjudicator has made their recommendations. CDs (or cassette tapes) of Choirs recommended to the provincial level of competition will be sent to the Performing Arts BC office.

Adjudicators give consideration to...

- Stylistic interpretation, intonation, dynamics, blend, balance.
- Diction, phrasing, and whether repertoire is appropriate to the age level.
- Acapella singing is encouraged.

PROCEDURE FOR CHOIRS

Arrive 30 minutes before the class is to begin.

Should a warm-up room be required, ask at the Festival's Venue desk. Fifteen (15) minutes before class is to begin, check with a Festival official for assigned seating.

Clip the registration slips to the pages of the selections to be performed and place them at the Adjudicator's table at the start of your class. Pick up music from the Adjudicator's Secretary after adjudication.

CHOIR CLASSES

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CHOIRS

Two or three contrasting selections. One selection may have limited instrumental accompaniment.

Primary (boys and girls).....Kindergarten to Grade 3

Intermediate (boys and girls)Grades 4 to 6

Mixed (Boys and Girls).....Kindergarten to Grade 6

Girls Choir.....Kindergarten to Grade 6

Boys Choir.....Kindergarten to Grade 6

MIDDLE/SECONDARY SCHOOL CHOIR

Two or three contrasting selections, one of which must be sung in three or more parts.

Concert ChoirBoys-only, Girls-only, or Mixed

Chamber Choir.....Boys-only, Girls-only, or Mixed

AcapellaBoys-only, Girls-only, or Mixed

Grades, categories and divisions will determine classes.

Junior

Two or three contrasting selections, one of which must be sung in two or more parts.

Junior A 10 years and under

Intermediate/Senior 19 years and under

QUICK STUDY - Competitors may enter only one quick study of the same grade level as their other entries. Students of the selected composer are ineligible. The selection will be available 4 days before the scheduled performance date.

CONTEMPORARY IDIOM - Conservatory Canada has published a "Contemporary Idiom" Syllabus which may be found on-line at conservatorycanada.ca. Selections are listed by levels; 1 through 8. You may choose a selection matching your level of ability from those listed. Alternatively, selections may be chosen from any other recognized syllabus, or, others of an equivalent level. You need not enter other classes to be eligible for Contemporary Idiom.

ADDITIONAL REPERTOIRE - A selection in a category not offered in the Festival Syllabus, or a second selection in a category already entered once.

BACH, J.S. - A selection composed by J. .S. Bach only.

BAROQUE/EARLY KEYBOARD - Music of the Baroque period (up to 1750) as represented by the music of Telemann, Scarlatti, Handel, Rameau, Couperin, etc. (excluding J.S. Bach).

CANADIAN - Works of recognized Canadian composers such as Archer, Dolin, Bayley, Beckwith, Bucynski, Coulthard, Ethridge, Fleming, Hansen, Kenins, Marsden, Melecci, Poole, Chatman, Reubart, Paterson (etc).

SONNET (SEQUENCE) – INT/SR - 2 sonnets joined by a work or theme that is common to both.

DUO POETRY - A poem recited by two people. Poems that are conversations, dialogues or have two distinct moods work well.

Time limit..... 13 yrs & under (3 min).... 16 yrs & under (4 min).... 17 yrs & over (5 min)

PROSE - A selection or excerpt taken from a novel, short story or essay: e.g. Treasure Island, Lord of the Flies, essays by William Hazlitt, Charles Lamb, George Orwell, short stories by Stephen Leacock, Katherine Mansfield. The focus should be on the voice. Vocal characterization is encouraged but the quality of prose must be maintained. The selection should include narration, description and dialogue. It should be spoken in the storytelling style, but should not be performed as a dramatic scene, i.e. there is to be no acting. Participants may stand or be seated.

SOLO DRAMA - An excerpt from a published play intended to be presented on stage by an actor assuming language, movement and dress of original character. The scene should be stated. Stand-alone monologues (not from longer plays) are unacceptable at the Provincial level.

DUO DRAMA - A scene for two players from any play. May be adapted from a story. Scenes should be staged as though taken from the complete performance. Simple costumes and props may be used.

GROUP DRAMA - 3 to 7 actors – An excerpt from a published play or a dramatization of a story. Simple costumes or props may be used.

Time limit.(Solo/Duo/Group)..... 14 yrs & under (5 min)..... 15 yrs & over (8 min)

SOLO SHAKESPEARE - A monologue of one character from a play by William Shakespeare. Lines of other characters may be cut, and a series of speeches performed as a monologue if the sense of the passage can be maintained. Limited use of costumes and props.

Time limit..... 14 yrs. & under (4 min)..... 15 years and over (6 min)

DUO SHAKESPEARE - A scene for two from any of Shakespeare's plays. To be performed as if from the play in its entirety. Limited use of costumes and props.

MIME – DUO MIME – GROUP MIME - A performance of a brief story without words. The title may be announced out loud or displayed on a card before the performance begins. Music background is permitted. A chair or a single prop may be used.

PROCEDURE

Ensure that the name of your instrument is on the Entry Form.
Your instrument should be tuned before entering the performance room. 30 seconds will be allowed to make any minor necessary adjustments.
Participants are responsible for supplying their own music stands.
Only piano accompaniment is permitted (unless otherwise specified).
Participants must provide their own accompanist and include the accompanist's name on the Entry Form.

MUSIC CATEGORIES

Select entries from the following list of categories:

ADDITIONAL REPERTOIRE - A selection in a category not offered in the Festival Syllabus or a second selection in a category already entered once.

BAROQUE - Music of the Baroque period (up to 1750).

CANADIAN - A work by a recognized Canadian composer.

WOODWINDS & BRASS (CONTINUED)

CLASSICAL - Music of the Classical period (circa 1750-1825): Mozart, Haydn, Beethoven, etc.
Sonata – Grades 6 – 8.....One movement.
Grade 9 and over.....Two contrasting movements.

CONCERTO - Grade 6 – 8.....One movement.
Grade 9 and over.....Two contrasting movements.

CONCERT PROGRAM - Two or three contrasting selections. One of the selections may be one grade higher. (One mark for the overall performance).

FRENCH - Music by French composers such as Busser, Chaminade, Duvernoy, Enesco, Faure, etc.

JAZZ SOLO - Some improvisation. Piano accompaniment or unaccompanied only.

ROMANTIC

Music of the Romantic period (1825-1910) ie. Schumann, Grieg, Mendelssohn, Schubert, Brahms, Tchaikovsky, etc. or pieces written in a definite Romantic style by later composers.

SIGHT READING - The participant will be given an unfamiliar selection of music to study briefly. At the Adjudicator’s signal, the performer must play a designated section.

TWENTIETH/TWENTYFIRST CENTURY - Music of Twentieth century composers (excluding Canadian) ie. Bartok, Anderson, Satie, etc.

UNACCOMPANIED SOLO - Grade 6 and over – Music must be written to be played without accompaniment.

DUET (ANY CATEGORY) - Use a separate DUET/GROUP ENTRY FORM.

The “principal” partner (higher grade) **MUST** submit the Entry Form and payment, including full information on both partners. Include Duet information on both participants’ Solo Entry Forms. Split fees will not be accepted.

ENSEMBLES.....Two contrasting selections


3 to 6 performers – A combination of any recognized orchestral instruments. (One performer to a part). Piano may be included. When piano is included, the piano part must be original and not an orchestral reduction. Entry is to be submitted and paid for by one member. Please include the name, age, grade and instrument of each member, as well as group information on each member’s Solo Entry

PERCUSSION - One selection, with or without piano accompaniment. Performance time 5 minutes or less.
